- If you had planned to pay at the door and you were not able to attend, but did not cancel by the deadline date, please send your check. This is because we still had to pay for your meal.



NC State Volleyball Earns First NCAA Berth Since 1987

For the first time in 25 years, NC State's volleyball team headed to the NCAA Championships. The Wolfpack (22-9 overall, 12-8 ACC) played Texas A&M on Thursday, November 29 in Austin, Texas, in a first-round matchup. (At the time of the printing of this newsletter, the results were not known.)

The Wolfpack set a school record for ACC wins and had its highest ACC finish since 1991. NC State (22-9 overall, 12-8 ACC) is one of four ACC teams to earn a berth in the 64-team field, along with champion Florida State, Miami and North Carolina.

The 4,316 new freshmen came from an impressive pool of applicants. **More than 20,000** people sought admission as freshmen, the most in university history. The average SAT score for this year's enrollees is 1219, the first time a group of Wolfpack freshmen has averaged better than a 1200.



December 13 Lunch Program Noon Note Change in Time for 2012-13 Meetings University Room at University Club


