

- Player Kody Burke is a two-time Academic All-America selection. She has scored 1,103 points in her career, and begins her senior season with 164 blocks - 40 more will give her the NC State career record, passing Genia Beasley's 203 from 1977-80.
- Markeisha Gatling averaged a team-leading 13.8 points and 8.5 rebounds over the final six games of the 2012-13 season. She will be a key figure in the post for the Wolfpack again in 2013-14. She shot 57.7% from the floor last year, the 2nd best figure in the ACC.
- Len'Nique Brown averaged 5.3 assists per game when she started the final 12 games of the 2012-13 season. Twice she flirted with a triple-double last season - 10 points, nine rebounds and seven assists off the bench against Auburn & 13 points, nine assists, seven boards in a win at No. 19 Florida State.
- Myisha Goodwin-Coleman tied a school and ACC record with nine three-pointers last season against Georgia Tech on Feb. 17, setting a career high with 30 points that night off the bench. She shot a team-best 38.3% last year from beyond the arc.
- The 2013-14 season will be the 40th in the history of NC State's women's basketball program.

If you have not already indicated the number of items you will be donating, please do so by checking the box on this month's reservation form. We want to have plenty of space to display the wonderful items.

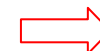
NC State Women's Basketball Quick Facts

- Wes Moore owns a 558-169 (76.8%) career coaching record. He is the eighth "winningest" coach among active Division I women's basketball head coaches. Moore won 12 Southern Conference regular season titles in 15 years at UTC from 1999-2013.
- NC State has six seniors on its 2013-14 roster, the most since the 2006-07 club that made the NCAA Sweet 16.

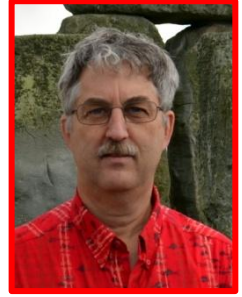

This is a unique opportunity to learn about arts and crafts such as pottery, woodworking, fibers, glass, painting and jewelry **taught at NC State's Crafts Center. The facility is open to** all interested students, faculty, and staff, as well as the general public. We'll meet the Director, George Thomas, and hear from several students about their experiences and have a chance to participate in a "ticket raffle" for handmade pieces of art. Proceeds will go to the Carol Caldwell Scholarship Endowment funded by the NC State University Woman's Club and its members.



As Director of The Crafts Center, George Thomas leads one the largest University Craft Centers in the United States. The Crafts Center provides studio time and supports academic classes, projects, and independent studies. Since returning to Thompson Hall after renovation in 2009, emphasis has been placed in the creation of a new level of programming aimed at improving campus life. The Crafts Center is located in the Frank Thompson Hall and offers a state-of-the-art facility. Mr. Thomas has taught woodworking classes at The Crafts Center since 1989. He was also a student volunteer from 1978 to 1982 and a community volunteer from 1982 to 1989 while he taught technology education at Garner Middle School. He is an NC State graduate with a degree in Technology Education.
