Women of NC State: More Fun Facts...



In 1940, Gertrude Cox was hired as professor of statistics and head of the Department



of Experimental Statistics in November. She became the first woman to serve as a full

professor and department head.



Twenty-three years after Gertrude Cox's appointment, Eloise Cofer, extension professor of food science from 1963 and assistant director of the agricultural extension service, was the second woman to be appointed a full professor. In 1980 Cofer was named home economist of the year by the N.C. Home Economics Association.



Today, one of our dozens of

female full professors is a Fellow in the Royal Academy of Science and a member of the National Academy of Science. Trudy Mackay, William Neal Reynolds Distinguished University



Professor of Genetics, is blazing new trails in research and inspiring this generation of students, as Drs. Cox and Cofer did in their times.
