Historical Tidbits

Since the 1970s, women have achieved a significant presence at NC State. Female students, scientists, engineers, and administrators serving the university today owe some debt to the women who dared to be the first: Adeline Stevens—the first female faculty member listed in the catalog as an instructor in biology (1902); Lucille Thomson—the first woman regularly enrolled as a student (1921); the first three women who graduated from NC State in 1927—Jane McKimmon, Charlotte Nelson, and Mary Yarbrough; and Gertrude Cox—the first woman full professor and department head (1940).

On January 4, 1984, then-Chancellor Bruce Poulton established the NCSU Council on Women's Affairs. He stated:

I am this date establishing an Advisory Council on Women's Affairs...to advise the NCSU Chancellor and Provost on matters pertaining to the needs of women at NCSU and to enhance a positive, harmonious University environment supporting the fullest development of all human potential.
