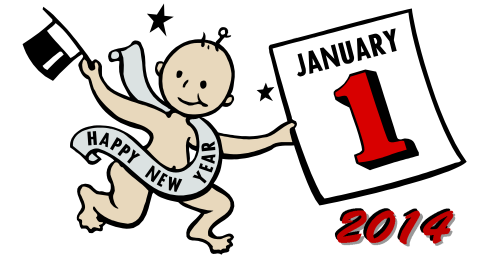

His job here is to lead the strategy for Information Technology at NC State as well as keep IT operations running smoothly. He held numerous administrative positions at the University of Florida previously. Hoit received his B.S. from Purdue University, M.S. and Ph.D. from University of California, Berkeley.
