### **Program – Secrets and Scary Tales of the Capitol – October 19, 2017**

Terra Schramm currently serves as the site administrator for the NC State Capitol historic site. She holds a BS in Public History from East Carolina University and a MA in Public History from NCSU. Terra previously served as the docent and tour coordinator for the NC Executive Mansion.

Lecture description -- Completed in 1840, the State Capitol has served as the seat of North Carolina government for nearly two centuries. This Greek Revival masterpiece, now recognized as a National Historic Landmark, has witnessed war, secession, recessions, depressions, and survived largely unchanged. Once home to the executive, legislative, and judicial branches of state government, the Capitol functions today as a vibrant historic site and the official office of the Governor. Join site administrator Terra Schramm for a comprehensive look at the history of the Capitol and Union Square. This talk will highlight entertaining and enlightening stories of the people and events that have shaped the course of history in our state. – *Lou Mitchell*

Caldwell, who served from 1959 to 1975. As "first lady" of NC State, Carol Caldwell was a faithful mentor, member, and advocate of the NCSU Woman's Club.

The Carol Caldwell Scholarship has been awarded to worthy students since 1984, and we have heard the testimonies of many of these very appreciative recipients at Club meetings over the years. The Club and its members continue to support this scholarship, and the endowment has reached more than \$160,450 – thus allowing scholarship awards into perpetuity. ## **Program**

Grace Hodgson introduced our guest speaker, Dr. Ola L. A. Harrysson, NC State Professor Industrial and Systems Engineering, from the College of Engineering. Dr. Harrysson is originally from Sweden and earned his Ph.D from NC State. He has been working at NC State for 15 years and has made great strides in the biomedical research area.

Dr. Harrysson shared a PowerPoint show explaining 3D printing projects/processes and discussed many examples where dogs, turtles and cats have benefited from the 3D printing projects between the College of Engineering and the College of Veterinary Medicine. Many success stories included animals that have been helped from limb sparing transplants, corrected mouth palates, cat jaw replacements, prosthetics for animals, etc. He has also worked in the equestrian area while at NC State.

He is the Director of the NCSU Center for Additive Manufacturing and Logistics (CAMAL).

Dr. Harrysson and his team are also working on custom implants for humans. Sweden is very interested in his projects as they have a very successful program in this area as well. Members enjoyed learning about Dr. Harrysson's successful research program and were thrilled that many animals are being helped via his program. Dr. Harrysson entertained lots of questions at the end of his presentation.

Grace Hodgson thanked Dr. Harrysson for his presentation.
